CHILD SENSITIVE SOCIAL PROTECTION

Save the Children Philippines adopted Child Sensitive Social Protection (CSSP) as a key global strategy to ensure that social protection programs have a maximum impact on children.¹ A cornerstone of CSSP is to make parents receiving social protection more sensitive to children's development needs and to enhance parenting behaviors that will support children's social, emotional and cognitive development – this will help children progress in life and increase their chances of doing well in school and eventually to seek out opportunities that will make them prosper in life.

RATIONALE

A study commissioned by Save the Children Philippines in Leyte confirmed that there is ample scope and need to strengthen parenting practices among DSWD 4Ps beneficiaries. Parents understand 'good parenting' as making sure they provide for their children, that they stay in school and that children become obedient. There is limited appreciation of the need to spend quality time with children, to listen to children, and to engage with children in ways that would stimulate their development.²



The Mahusay family's primary source of income is through their tricycle earnings. Through their learnings from the 4Ps training they participated, they were able to earn additional income from their small family business which helps send all their children to school.

After participating in the 4Ps learning sessions, Vincent, a construction worker, and his wife, Margie, a stay-at-home mother, was able to sell bananas from their farm that now provides them additional source of income to help augment their daily needs.
