ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Anticipatory Action Trial project aims to proactively address the impact of flooding in Tanay, Rizal, Philippines.

The trial is focused to build capacity and preparedness to implement anticipatory action plans in order to mitigate the effects of flooding on vulnerable populations, including women, children, elderly, persons with disabilities, and indigenous peoples.

By monitoring weather disturbances, river status, and heavy rainfall, the project can provide early warning and activate anticipatory actions before the flood event occurs.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

Goal: Children and their families, especially women and girls, are able to prepare for, anticipate, and cope from flooding.

Outcome: To increase their knowledge and capacities to anticipate flooding and reduce its negative impacts to their families and livelihoods.



STRATEGIES

The Project aims to prioritize engagement with at-risk populations, empower them through capacity building, involve them in decision-making processes, and enhance their resilience to flooding in Tanay, Rizal. Strategies include:

1. Involvement of vulnerable groups, including Persons with Disabilities, women's groups, Indigenous groups, and children's groups in the vulnerability assessment to understand their specific challenges, priorities, and needs related to flood hazards.
2. Provision of training on early warning systems and action protocols, empowering communities to respond effectively to flood risks and emergencies.
3. Aid the BDRRMC in creating a Community Anticipatory Action Plan for floods, based on vulnerability assessment, council protocols, and recommendations from sectoral groups to guide coordinated actions and response measures.
4. Create an accessible channels for feedback and dialogue to enhance the community's risk communication system, promoting timely information transfer and active participation.
5. Follow an adaptive management approach, learning and improving based on input from at-risk population and regular reviews will update protocols and risk assessments.



WHERE WE WORK

Project FLAIR works with the community members from barangays Sampaloc, Daraitan, and Plaza Aldea in the Municipality of Tanay, Rizal to directly reach a total of **500 households** and indirectly reach **4,769 households**.
